Birth & Beyond Program

The Birth & Beyond Program focuses on overburdened families and children incorporating home visiting and family resource centers as a strategy for service delivery. A team of professionals, paraprofessionals, and residents of the community provide services.

Service Position Title: AmeriCorps Home Visitor

Service Position Summary:

The AmeriCorps Home Visitor shall serve as the family's primary contact with the Birth & Beyond (B&B) Program. The Home Visitor is responsible for developing a relationship with the family and working in their home and community to build upon strengths and to enhance self-sufficiency. The Home Visitor reports to the Team Leader.

Essential Functions:

1. Home Visitation & Documentation (70%)

- Conduct regularly scheduled home visits to assigned families, to provide the Nurturing Parenting Program to parents and children in their homes.
- Conduct screens and assessments on all assigned families.
- Work with families to empower them to engage in problem solving.
- Model effective parenting behavior, provides support, education/ information, and provides parents with age appropriate parenting and positive discipline techniques.
- Promote parent participation in home activities (lesson) designed to promote the physical, emotional, social, and intellectual development of their children.

- Work with families to develop, review, and update Family Nurturing Plans per Birth & Beyond Policies & Procedures under the direction of the Team Leader.
- Model nurturing attitudes and behaviors in all contacts with program participants and program staff.
- Utilize community resources, in-home teaching, and supportive problem solving to help families meet the goals of their nurturing plans.
- Advocate for and act as a liaison for families with existing community services and agencies, which may include routine translation and interpretation.
- Complete documentation as required by B&B Policies & Procedures; including but not limited to: Face to Face reports; Family Nurturing Plan; Multi-Disciplinary Resource Team forms; Immunization Records; Critical Incident Reports, CPS reports, etc.

2. Supervision, Multi-Disciplinary Resource Team Case Reviews, Training (20%)

- Attend 1 hour a week supervision with the Team Leader.
- Participate as a member of the B&B Multi-Disciplinary Resource Team (MRT) of service providers, presenting assigned families to the MRT as required.
- Consult with MRT members regarding issues the family may experience that need additional assessments, referrals, or services.
- Facilitate and document ongoing progress of the MRT action plan.
- Attend required B&B trainings provided by The Child Abuse Prevention Center, the County of Sacramento, and its Contractors.

Marginal Functions:

1.. Other Duties Related to Service Activity (10%), including but not limited to:

- Maintain a safe, clean, resourceful, and enriching FRC environment for families and staff.
- Assist with and participate in the Family Resource Center (FRC) as needed (i.e., playcare, community events/fairs, etc.).
- Participate in AmeriCorps National Service Days.
- Assist with and participate in outreach, community engagements, referrals, and volunteer generation.
- Perform other duties as assigned that are associated with the AmeriCorps B&B Performance Measures.

Knowledge, Skills and Abilities:

- Must be able to read, write, speak and understand the English language.
- Must have basic computer skills.
- Ability to work with diverse workgroups and teams.
- Ability to serve families with diverse economic, social, racial, and cultural backgrounds.
- Knowledgeable about local community resources.
- Ability to establish and maintain personal and programmatic boundaries while providing supportive services.
- Strong interpersonal skills and the ability to relate to individuals who may not share basic commonality, including value systems and behavior norms.
- Experience in working with culturally diverse communities and families, with the ability to be culturally sensitive and appropriate.
- Demonstrate good writing and organizational skill.
- Skill to maintain a professional, confidential work environment.
- Ability to self-initiate multiple tasks in an efficient manner.
- Must have the ability to be a self-starter and work independently.
- Knowledge of child abuse issues, substance abuse, family dynamics, and domestic violence.
- Knowledge of child development and behavior.
- Ability to establish and maintain personal and programmatic boundaries while providing supportive services.
- Strong interpersonal skills and the ability to relate to individuals who may not share basic commonality, including value systems and behavior norms.
- Ability to work evenings and weekends, as required.
- Ability to communicate clearly both orally and in writing.
- Ability to communicate professionally & effectively.
- Experience in social services in community settings with families preferred.
- Able to deal with stressful situations.
- Must report to service site as scheduled and agreed upon with Host Site Supervisor.
- Must be able to lift & carry a minimum of 15 lbs.
- Ability to frequently bend, twist, squat, kneel, reach, push, and pull.

Other Qualifications:

- Must be at least 18 years of age.
- Must be a U.S. citizen or lawful permanent resident.
- Clearance of fingerprint background check.
- Must possess a high school diploma or GED.
- Must possess a valid California Driver's license, reliable transportation and auto insurance.
- Able to travel between sites and to offsite events.
